

Old Bloodline Waler Pinjee



Hale and Pinjee, first day 4 November 2019

Old Bloodline Waler Pinjee (pronounced Benjie) was born on 4 November 2019 in Taradale, Victoria to Old Bloodline Waler mare Hale, sire unknown. Hale was born on remote traditionally owned land on the edge of the Simpson Desert, Northern Territory. Dam and sire unknown. Hale's DNA ancestry testing reveals a touch of Galiceno, Garrano and Cream Draft went into the melting pot way back when.

Our careful research indicates that this herd has been roaming wild since breeding of Walers for export stopped in the 1950's, with no other bloodline mixed in. They are as closely descended from the first and the best horses which arrived in the NT when the worldwide horse scene and Australia's overseas horse trade was at its heyday as it is possible for any horse in the 21st century to be. The Waler characteristics which were so prized have been well preserved and the horses have continued to survive in the toughest of environments, just as they were originally bred to.



Pinjee is a bay dun, with dorsal stripe, wither cross, stripes at the back of his knees, and dark points on his ears. His DNA breed ancestry testing shows rare old bloodlines of Galiceno, Belgian Draft and Campolina. He is bold and handsome, with a thoughtful demeanour.

Pinjee lives at Darraweit Guim in Victoria, sharing a paddock with Waler stallion Newhaven Virtuoso, who just like Pinjee is the son of a foundation Waler mare, sire unknown. Ideally Pinjee will be kept entire to preserve his important and rare bloodlines.
